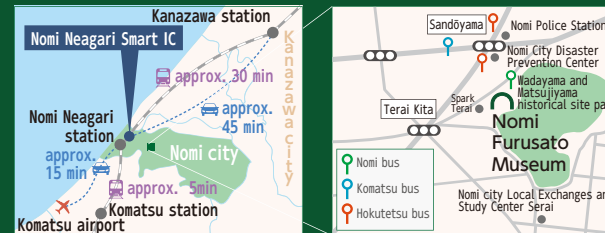

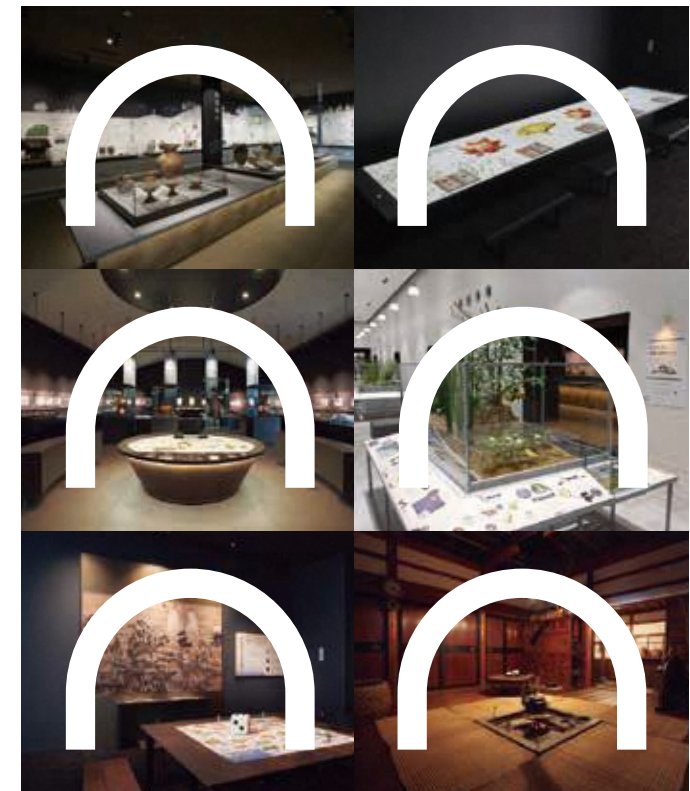
Bus

NOMI FURUSATO MUSEUM



The life before the spread of electric appliances. (the Taishō and the Shōwa periods)
This exhibition recreates life in the Taishō and the Shōwa periods with utensils commonly used then.



From the sea to the mountains.
The beginning of "Nomi" 1200 years ago.
This hall introduces the flow of history from the Asuka period to the Heian period that gave birth to the name Nomi. It also features an open stack of artifacts.



The plain and the big river.
Big graves and the formation of the province.
Exhibiting 4 sets of armor and Sue ceramics with inscriptions on them, the oldest in Japan. This hall introduces the period from the first tumuli built to the end of their building. This tumuli group was designated as a national historic site, and we present valuable and rich materials about them.



Conducting special exhibitions on various themes (charged and free of charge).

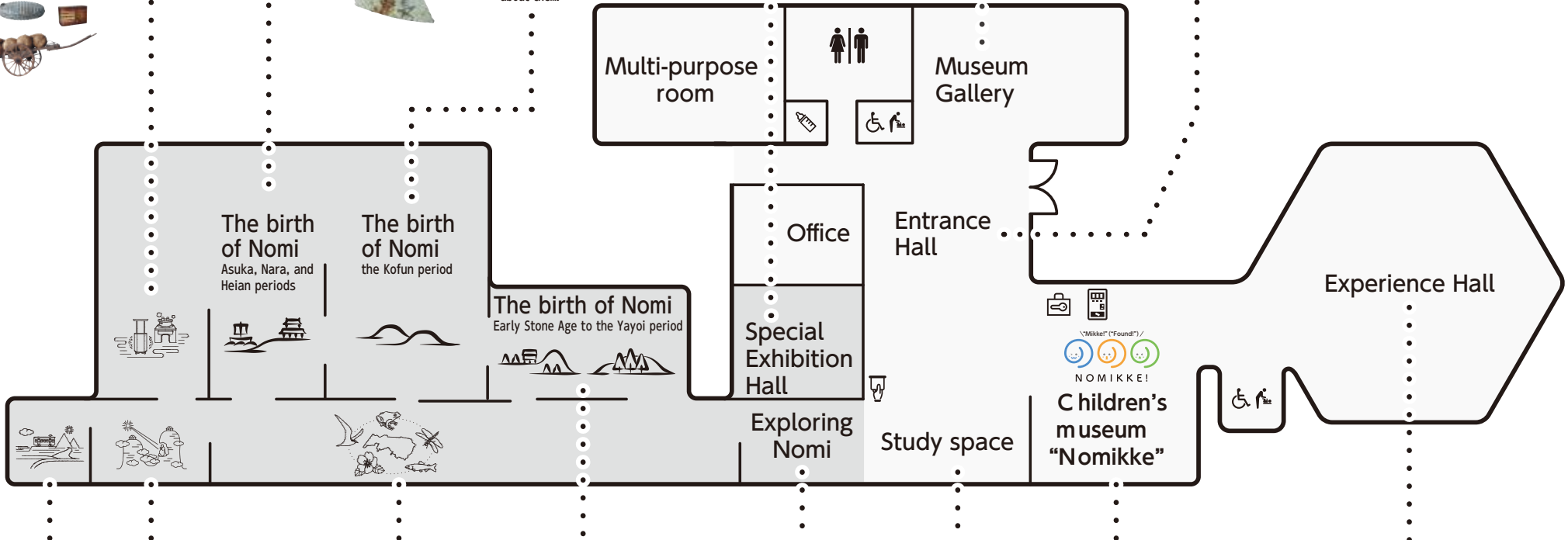
Housing special exhibitions and works by local artists.

Introducing the Nomiden railway that supported the modernization of Nomi.



The age when "Hakusan mandala" was drawn. (the Edo period)
Here you can learn about "Hakusan Mandala" color-painted on silk (Ishikawa prefecture designated cultural asset) by playing a board game. It depicts legends connected to Mount Hakusan.
