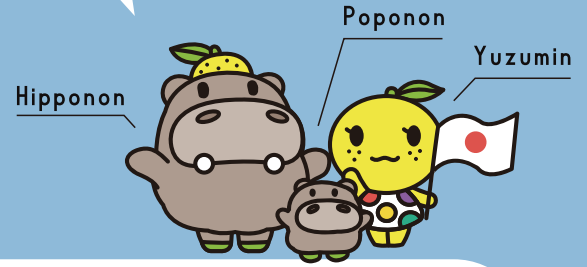

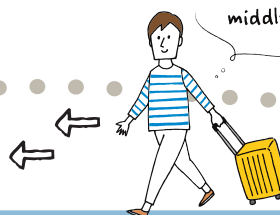

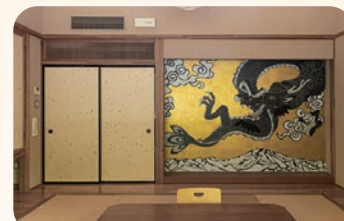

62 burial mounds of various sizes and shapes were discovered on the independent hills of Teraiyama, Wadayama, Matsujiyama, Akitsuneyama, and Nishiyama. They were built about 1,600 years ago during the Kofun period. Visitors can enjoy hiking while viewing seasonal flowers.
